Related Services

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires the IEP to include a description of any related services a student requires to benefit from special education services. Related services refer to developmental, corrective, and other supportive services.

Speech-Language Services	Speech-language services are designed to help students who have communication deficits perform important learning and school-related activities.	Speech-language services can address:
Physical Therapy Services	Physical therapy addresses a student's muscle strength, mobility, and organization of movement in the school setting.	Physical therapy can address: Gross motor function Functional mobility Environmental adaptations Equipment needs
Occupational Therapy	Occupational Therapy focuses on daily living skills and supports students' ability to function and participate in the school setting.	Examples of areas of need addressed by Occupational Therapy include: • Balance • Body awareness • Sensory regulation • Executive functioning • Attention
Transportation	Transportation services include travel to school and from school. Transportation services may include specialized equipment such as specialized buses, lifts, ramps or other necessary equipment.	Transportation services can address: • Mobility needs • Behavioral needs • Safety needs
